Read: John 12:20 – 19:42

In John 12:23, Jesus says: “The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly I tell you, unless a kernel of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains only a single seed. But if it dies, it produces many seeds.” These chapters in John take us through the last days of Jesus’ life, death and his glorification. See what you can learn about how the Son is glorified in his death and what this reveals to us about the Father. Also, what are the benefits for us of Jesus being glorified?

QUESTIONS FROM THE TEXT

1. Read John 12:23-36. How will the Son of Man be glorified?

2. Read John 13:1-17. Skim verses 18-38. How does Jesus, knowing that he had come from God and was returning to God, impact his last actions with his disciples?

3. Read John 14: 1-7, 15-21. What resources does Jesus offer those he loves which will be experienced when He is gone to be with the Father?
 - A home
 - An advocate

4. Read John 15:1-17. What is Jesus' relationship with the Father and how is that passed on to those who are connected to Him?
5. How do we abide in "the vine"?

Guided by the Father

6. Read John 15:26-16:15. Why is it good for us that Jesus goes to be with the Father?
7. What will the Spirit guide us into?

8. Read John 17:1-26. What are the three areas that Jesus prays for?
9. What is Jesus' ultimate goal for his disciples?

Jesus: King of the Jews

10. Skim John: 18:28-19:42. List the text references that refer to the Kingship of Jesus in these verses.
11. What does John the writer emphasize in these chapters leading to and including the crucifixion of Jesus?

APPLYING THE TEXT

The willing death of Jesus is not the end, but the beginning and points to something much bigger. How can you tell this story is going somewhere beyond ending in his death alone? What does Jesus say his death will produce, as seeds that die produce fruit? What fruit does the glory of God produce in your life as you believe in this message and follow Jesus?
